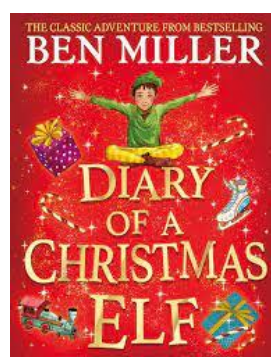
The Night I Met Father Christmas by Ben Miller
