Sport at Preston Hedges in 2022-2023:

- Take up of sports clubs has been particularly high – above 90% in all year groups
- Children have continued to have opportunities to increase their variety of sporting activities – such as curling, golf, cheerleading and martial arts have been offered, led by pupil voice
- We have continued to achieve well in sporting competitions, coming 1st in the Mat Olympics for the second year running!
