RECEPTION

A WALK IN THE WOODS

You may have noticed that our environment has changed over the half term holiday and that our new topic for this term is 'A Walk in the Woods' which links to the books 'The Gruffalo' and 'Stick Man'. The children have already had fun exploring all things woodland both indoors and outdoors. Through this topic we will be exploring seasonal changes as autumn turns to winter, as well as, investigating changing states of matter when we identify the signs of winter and how water turns into ice and how we get snow! We will be exploring our Expressive Arts and Design through our Nativity performance and exploring the world around us by thinking about the different celebrations that people and communities have around the world.












LITERACY



Literacy this term is linked to the story 'The Gruffalo' and 'Stick Man'. The Reception children will sequence key events in a story, read and write simple labels, and begin to describe characters by writing all words in a simple phrase.



We are also very excited to write letters to Santa himself!!

Finally, we have a very exciting trip to the Derngate Theatre to watch Stick Man in December which will be a wonderful experience for all the children and really bring our topic book to life!







MATHS

This term in Maths Reception will look closely at 2D shapes, work on simple addition problems, and compare length using mathematical language.

It's that wonderful time of the year where Reception children take part in our Christmas Nativity we will be singing, dancing and acting our way towards Christmas. There will be two performances on the 1st of December one at 9.30am and again at 2.15pm! Tickets are now available, two per child! Please hand your reply slips directly to your child's class teacher. 


LITERACY

During our literacy sessions this half term, the children will be looking at character descriptions using the book 'Greta and the Giants' as the stimulus. We will be encouraging the children to use a wide range of descriptive vocabulary



including adjectives, verbs and expanded noun phrases. We will also be looking at using an exclamation mark to make our sentences more exciting. In the last part of the term, we will be looking at letter writing using the book 'The Jolly Christmas Postman' as a stimulus. The children will learn about question sentences and how to use a question mark.



MATHS

This half term, we are focusing on shape and measurement. The children have enjoyed learning to tell the time to o'clock and half past, as well as sequencing a variety of time events. For the rest of the half term we will be looking at 2d shapes and their properties, repeating patterns and measuring length and height.







CURRICULUM

This year, our history curriculum is focusing on key British time periods linked to the Royal Family. This half term, the children will be studying 'The Tudor' time period; focusing on the reign of King Henry VIII and



how some of his decisions as King still influence our lives today.

We are continuing to focus on seasonal changes during our weekly science lessons. We have investigated how day length varies across the seasons using our knowledge from last half term. The children will be

learning about the differences between deciduous and evergreen trees and seeing if we can identify some of these trees around the school grounds.

In RE, we are planning to have a trip to our local church in Wootton to understand that the church is a place where Christian's worship, pray and celebrate. Towards the end of term, we will be looking at the importance of the Christmas story for Christians and how different people celebrate Christmas.

YEAR 1 CHRISTMAS SERVICE

We would like to invite you to our Christmas Service at St George the Martyr Church, Wotton. on Monday 11th December, at 2pm. The children will be telling the Christmas story accompanied by some traditional Christmas songs.
