

## Sports Premium Strategy 2023 - 2024

## Headlines of Impact from Funding for 2023-2024:

- Take up of sports clubs among targeted groups has been particularly high 85% of SEND pupils, and 93% of children eligible for the Pupil Premium have taken part in extracurricular clubs
- All classes took part in an Olympic themed week, promoting both the 2024 Olympics and Paralympics for our children
- We have continued to achieve well in sporting competitions: in 92% of competitions, Preston Hedges placed in the top 3 schools, and in 54% of competitions we placed 1<sup>st</sup>. We also came 1<sup>st</sup> in the Y6 Trust Olympics for the third year running!
